
Rusty's parents were happy to see that he had had such a good time. They told him that they were glad he had met his cousins and that they hoped he would stay in touch with them.

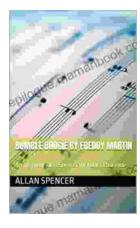
