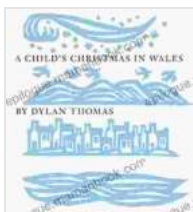

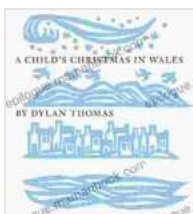
Epiphany

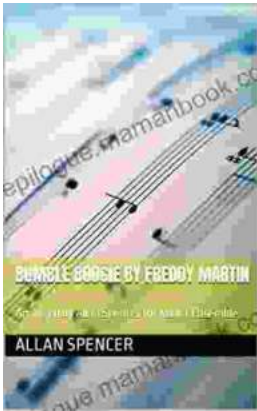
