
The Tiger and the Dragon: USS Stonewall Jackson (SSBN-634)



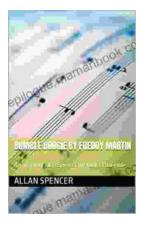
